### Garrison Issues Perjury Warrant

NEW ORLEANS, (CPD, -- Dist. Atty. Jim Garcison

NEW ORLEANS. (17b. -- Dist. Atty. Jim. Garrison Wednesday issued a perjury warrant for a Marine Corps buddy of Lee Harvey Oswald, arcusing him of lying when he said he never saw the presidential assassin after he left the Marines.

Kerry Thorntey of Tampa, Fla., a partitime author who once festified before the Warren Commission, appeared before the Orleans Parish (County) Grand Jury Feb. 8.

"In September of 1963 Kerry Thornley was closely associated with Lee Oswald at a number of locations in the city of New Orleans." Garrison said. "To say Mr. Thornley failed to tell the whole truth and that there was not the slightest effort to elient from him the whole truth Obefore the Warren Commission is an understatement."

Thornley told newsmen after his appearance before the grand jury the last time he saw Oswald was in June of 1959.

Thornley is the second Warren Commission witeess Garrison has charged with perjury. The first, attorney Pean Andrews of New Orleans, was consicted last year and is now appealing the consiction.

Thornley said he lived in New Orleans about three years during the early 1960s, but that he never saw Oswald, who also lived in the Louisiana city.

"I may have passed him and not recognized him and as far as I know he never saw me," he said.

Garrison said his office "has succeeded in identifying the assassination of President Kennedy as an operation, conducted by elements of the CIA," and that Dulles is needed to terify about CIA activities,

### Garrison Calls In Marina

NEW ORLEANS, (UPD.—A somber Marina Oswald Porter and two other witnesses were hustled in and out of the Orleans Parish (Courty) grand jury chambers Thursday to tell what they know of Lee Harvey Oswald's life in New Orleans loans.

Orwald's blue-eyed, Russian-born widow appeared brie'ly as she rushed down the c. imiral courthouse corrido; tlanked by her husband, Kenneth Porter of Richardson, Tex., and an aide to Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison.

She was bundled up in a gold overcoat and flushed from 36 degree weather out-

"All I want to do is go inside," she whispered, brushing off reporters.

Kerry Thornley of Tampa, Fla., and Thomas Beckham of Onaha, Neb, also appeared before the jury, but were taken in and out of the building on a private the building on a private e'evator.

However, after his appearance before the grand jury Thornley told newsmen that he had never seen Oswald in New Orleans.

"The last time I saw Os-wald was in June of 1959," Thorntey said. "I told the Warren Commission every-thing I know."


The part-time author indicated he did not think Oswald was a confirmed communist during the time the two knew each other in the Marine Corps.

### Texas Judge Sarah Hughes Urges U.S. Leave Vietnam

Federal Judge Sarah T. Hughes, who swore in President Johnson Nov. 22, 1963 aboard an Air Force plane, Saturday said the United States should get out of Vietnam. She said the Korean situation continues in the discussion

Judge Hughes arrived here from Dallas for a series of lectures in Puebla, Cuernavaca, and Monterrey.

"Everything in the Warren Report is true," she said, New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison had no evidence against it.

On the racial issue, she said deep-rooted customs had become ideas and that it would be hard to make the white people in the South change their minds with respect to Negroes.

Judge Hughes spoke with the reporters in Spanish and was assisted by Enrique Perales Jasso who met her at the airport with Elizabeth Rebecca Earle, cultural attache of the American Embassy.

### Says Mexico City Was Base Garrison Subpoenas Oswald's Widow

NEW ORLEANS. (AP) — Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison, who Wednesday subpoenaed the widow of Lee Harvey Oswald, says that Mexico City was used as a base of operations prior to the 1963 assassination of President Kennedy in Dallas.

Dallas.

In a 25-inhute telephone interview in Regina, Canada with CKCK radio's Lorne Harasen on the station's open line program. Garrison said two cities outside the United States were used as control bases. He said the two cities were Montreal and Mexico City.

He added that only Americans and a few Latin Americans were involved in the plot to kill President Kennedy. Garrison has asked Oswald's widow, Mrs. Marina Porter, to testify in his orobe of the Kennedy case, Mrs. Porter said she doubted she could help.

But Mrs. Porter, now a suburban Dallas housewife, did not say whether she would try to fight a subpoena ordering her to come to New Orleans to testify before a grand jury Feb. 8.

"I don't know if I could prove my innocence to him," Mrs. Porter said at her home in Richardson, Tex. "Mr. Cartison is so powerful."

The subpoena called Marina Oswald Porter "a material witness" in Garrison's investigation into an alleged New Orleans conspiracy to assassinate President John F. Kennede.

Not one other person sought outside Louisiana by Garrison has agreed to set foot in New Orleans — where Garrison has unloosed a barrage of charges which, if true, could shoot down the Warren report, a document which held that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone.

Nor has any state surrendered any of its residents to Garrison.

Howard, an unemployed welder, was not served with the subpoena until last Thursday norning, since he has been on a three-week trip to Mexico, a combination hunt-

ing and mining venture.

He has freely admitted that he trained Cuban anti-Castro guerrillas in blorida in the early 1980s but denies any acquaintance with men named by Garrison as assassination conspirators,

Garrison apparently is interested in both him and
Loran Engene Hall, Sd, because of a story told by Mrs.
Sylvia Odio, a Cuban refugee, about a pre-assassination
visit from three men, one of whom resembled Oswald.
Both Howard and Had have said since the issuance of

the subpoenas that they cannot remember meeting with Mrs. Oswald, and in 1964 FBI agents dismissed the relevance of her story.

". New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison will be proven accurate in his plot c harges," predicted Jeane Dixon, noted Washington, D.C. seeress who had predicted the assassination of Pres. John F. Kennedy.

In answer to a letter I wrote her asking what she thought of the Garrison investigation, Mrs. Dixon prefixed her remarks with:

"My 'opinion." I believe, is of no interest to anyone ...what I pick up psychically is..."

Mrs. Dixon further enlarged on her Garrison prediction by saying that a woman was a key figure in the assassination of President Kennedy, and that she ingish be revealed by the investigation going on in New Orleans some time this year.

She also said that the District Attorney will be thwarted in his probe by "a lot of power and money from outside the United States—and inside—before he finishes. However, she added, the mystery woman's involvement will come out in any event, sometime in history.

Mrs. Dixon has been the subject of a best seller called "A Gitt of Prophecy" written by Ruth Montgomery.

Among some of her other predictions were the death of Pres. Franklin D. Roosevelt, and the blackout that took place in New York in November of 1965. She ventured this latter prediction on Johany Carson's TV show in 1963.

### Inside Washington Garrison Begins To Attract Attention

WASHINGTON. — District Attorney Jim Garrison's controversial New Orleans investigation of the Kennedy assassination is beginning to attract some helated con-

e alonal attention.
Staffs of the House Committee on Unnairs of the House Committee on Characterian Activities and the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee are quietly checking into Garrison's wide-ranging inquiry to determine exactly what he is now up to up to.

At present, the attention of these congressional probers centers around Garrison's interest in and handling of (1) an official of the Ku Klux Klan and (2) a former congressional committee employe, who has given secret testimony before the New Orleans grand jury.

Significantly, both of these persons were reluctant witnesses in past congressional investigations not related to the Kennedy assassination.

The KKK official involved in Garrison's investigation is Jack M. Helm, the former exalted cyclops of the New Orleans, Souisiana, unit of the United Klams of America. He is now head of an independent KKK group which he consisted.

Summoned before the House Un-American Activities

Summoned before the House Un-American Activities Committee in January 1900 during the committee's probe of the KKK, he was an uncooperative witness. Helm, an operations manager of a New Orleans construction company, invoked the fifth, first, fourth, and fourteenth amendments of the Constitution in refusing to answer any of the questions put to him by committee manufactures.

The transcript of the committee hearings shows that one of the questions Helm refused to answer concerned his appearance on a speakers platform with three persons who were arrested in connection with the staying in Philadelphia, Mississippi, of three civil rights workers.

Testimony was presented during the hearing by a committee investigator that "At the rally Helm stated. "No congressional investigation will ever deteriorace this tKKK organization. We'll still be here when they are dead and buried — and I hope it will be soon."

Garrison began his probe of Helm on a tip from Jules Recco Kimbbe, a self-avowed member of the KKK, who also claimed he once worked special assignments for the CIA. This the CIA denies and Garrison claims he will prove.

According to Gartison, Kimble reported that on the day after the death of David Ferrie, one of Garrison's suspects in the alleged Kennedy assassination plot, he drove Helm to Ferrie's apartment. Helm then came out with a satchel full of papers which, Kimble says, the KKK official then placed in a bank safe deposit bax.

At this stage of his investigation Garrison refuses to say whether he has located the safe deposit box or recovered its mysterious contents.

However, aides of the district attorney are hinting that he has the key and that the box's contents will be revealed during next month's trial of Clay Shaw, the New Orleans businessman charged with being involved in a Kennedy assassination conspiracy.

Garrison is also probing an allegation of Kimble that Walter Sheridan, the former Justice Department trouble-shooter for then Attorney General Robert Kennedy, once counseled him not to talk to anyone and to go to Canada.

The former congressional employe whose furnishing of Information to Garrison has interested congressional probers is Harold Weisberg, author of books on the Kennedy assassnation attacking the Warren Commission, the

FBI and CIA.

According to records of the Senate Internal Security
Subcommittee and the House Un-American Activities Committee, Weisberg Is the same man who testified in 1940 before a House committee that he bought torged documents in an attempt to link the Dies committee to the Silver Shirts.

At that time the Silver Shirts was a militant right-wing organization on the attorney general's subversive list. The documents were used in an abortive attempt by a Michigan congressman to smear the Dies committee, fore-runner of the present House Committee on Un American

The records of the Senate Internal Security Subcommutee also show that Weisberg was dropped from the staff of the late Senator LaFollette's Special Investigating Subcommittee for allegedly leaking subcommittee confidential internation dential information.

We sherg, whose latest book carries a foreword by Gar-tison, has appeared several times before the New Orleans erand jury being used by the district attorney for his in-quiry. In his publications Welsberg contends that Lee Har-vey Oswald, accused Kennedy assassin, was framed by an impersonator.

The congressional probers are now checking Weisberg's long-time contacts in the Central Intelligence Agency and State Department, including several persons who transferred to those agencies from the Office of Strategic Services (OSS) after World War II.
