# 1) Recommendation IRG M58.8: Issues related to modern self-created characters (IRGN2521 & feedback, IRGN2536)

IRG recognizes the need to creating new ideographs, yet, IRG would not like to accept self-created characters that have no shared value. Based suggestions from IRGN2521&feedback and discussions at IRG#58, IRG instructs its convenor to draft a summarized text on this issue (IRGN2551) for further deliberation and inclusion in future IRG PnP.

The editors noted the self-created character issues in IRGN2521, and requested the IRG Convenor to draft a summarized text on this issue(IRGN2551) for further deliberation and inclusion in future IRG PnP.

### 3) IRG N2551, Restriction on encoding of modern self-created characters

#### 2. ROK reviewed IRG N2551 and suggests as follows:

- 1) Modern self-created hars for personal names are acceptable on the condition that the char follows the traditional composition principle of Hanzi chars.
- However, if there is no evidence that the char is fairly widely used in printed documents, the char is not acceptable.
- 2) When two chars of a personal name (e.g., '成龍') are combined into a single char, such a char is not acceptable.

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
